## Art Projects for Young People

With the help of Youth Offer funding, the Children & Young Peoples Action Group commissioned Art Shape, Gloucestershire Arts Charity, to put on a series of arts projects during February half term.

These took place in Matson, Podsmead and Quedgeley and incorporated all sorts of different activities including film, digital photography, print mosaic and a whole lot more.



As well as these three locally based events there was also a big mobile phone art project at the Guildhall, which involved passing young people taking part in a large collaborative digital artwork. This showed a snap shot of youth life by producing an animated film of text messages and photos sent by aged 13–19 yr olds. A large number of young people took part and also included those who only wanted to drop in and participate briefly. Participants from the other art projects were also encouraged to contribute via text or email to document their activities.

Harriet West, Art Shape project manager, said, "Young people are quite often portrayed negatively in the media, this project allowed them to choose how they are depicted and texting seems to come very naturally to young people".

## Coney Hill "Have your say" Day report



Following the Coney Hill Community Engagement event in Autumn 2009 an initial analysis has now been completed. Crime & Disorder Reduction Partnership (CDRP) representatives visited Stanway, Naunton, Hailes and Ullenwood Roads, Peggotty Bungalows, Druid's Lane and Coney Hill Parade, speaking with 109 residents. Results show that 95% of those residents feel safe when out alone in the daytime and 72% also feel safe at night. Issues raised are currently being followed up and a full report of the survey will be delivered to all residents in those roads.

## Matson resident wins Young Entrepreneur of the Year award

**Nineteen-year-old, young mum, Dani Jones, who runs the Streetcheer and Streetdance classes for young people in Matson, picked up a prestigious award in London on 2<sup>nd</sup> February.**

**StreetGames**, the national charity for youth doorstep sport, held its third birthday celebrations in the House of Commons to celebrate achievements over the last year.

Dani was presented with her award by MP Ben Bradshaw, Secretary of Sport and local MP for Gloucester Pharmjit Dhanda.

Dani said, "I am very pleased to be receiving this award, a big thank you to all the kids for their commitment and hard work."

StreetGames Gloucester is run by Gloucester City Council sports development service and gives local people the skills and qualifications to run the sessions.

Martyn White, cabinet member for heritage and leisure said: "This is a great area of work that helps young people like Dani assist their peers. Sport is a superb way of building strong local communities."

Dani qualified in June 2008 and has gone on to establish her own, weekly, community dance group for 8-16 year olds.

Her biweekly StreetCheer class, at the Redwell centre, has proved so popular there are already two squads, called Storm and Step 2 Street, of about 70 young local people (mixed ages and gender).

**"When you tell people you left school at 14, they assume you're not bright. That's not true at all. I am responsible for all the club paperwork, grant applications and budgeting. I like doing it - gives you a sense of "yeah, I did that". Lots of people have said I wouldn't do much. Well, they were wrong."** Dani added.

## Funded by the EU and NHS Gloucestershire.

The project, **Energy Ambassadors**, will operate alongside Health and Social Care professionals working with people who are either already living in fuel poverty or at risk. For example, groups affected may be older adults, families with young children or those with long-term health conditions, learning disabilities, mental ill health or the unemployed.

In addition to the related financial problems that clients may face, people who live in cold, damp homes as a result of fuel poverty are more likely to suffer from health inequalities such as respiratory problems and asthma. Living in fuel poverty can complicate cardio-vascular disease and contribute to mental ill-health and excess winter deaths.

**A good proportion of the excess winter deaths in the UK are related to factors which affect how warm a house is, for example, energy efficiency and insulation, central heating and household income.**

Free half day training sessions are being offered to equip professionals to be able to give practical energy and money saving advice in the home together with effective signposting to agencies that offer grants and funding for energy saving measures, such as insulation where appropriate.

Training is very flexible and can be run in your place of work at a time and date convenient for you or your team if appropriate.
